Since opening in 2002, the Zebra Centre was designed to support about 2,000 children and youth annually. Over the past five years, the number of children & youth coming to the Zebra Centre for services and supports have grown from 2,363 in 2019 to 4,362 in 2023, an **85% increase**!

After 22 years operating from the same downtown Edmonton, child-friendly environment, the Zebra Centre is moving in 2024. The new Zebra Centre will more than double the current size, allowing for enhanced and increased services and supports for the thousands of children and youth who come to the Centre for help every year!

Client Feedback

- 92.5% of caregivers said staff members at the Centre were friendly & pleasant.
- 94.3.% of caregivers said the Centre has been available to answer questions.
- 94.2% of caregivers said if they knew anyone else dealing with a situation like the one they faced, they would let them know about Zebra.

Two Children & Family Services Special Assessors based in the Zebra Centre conducted 732 child forensic interviews in 2023 to support the youngest children and most complex cases.

Based in the Zebra Centre, each CARRT team consists of one EPS Constable and one Child & Family Services Welfare Investigator. CARRT Teams are available 7 days a week and provide front-line supports for children at risk.

Zebra Centre Staff

Zebra Centre staff and volunteers are dedicated to supporting the Multi-Disciplinary Team in their specialized work relating to investigations, justice, and healing. Plus, the Zebra Centre works with dozens of other community partners and organizations to ensure specialized supports are provided as required.

Community Education

In 2023, we added a full-time Community Education Lead to our team. This resulted in 51 community tours of the Zebra Centre, 29 community events and displays, and 79 community presentations.

Philanthropy

The Zebra Centre must raise over \$500,000 from the community annually to fund our services and supports. We are incredibly grateful for the thousands of individual gifts received in 2023 and the 57 Community Fundraising Events and Campaigns that benefitted the Zebra Centre.



VIP (Very Important Paws) Facility Dog Program

Year over year, 100% of caregivers express being satisfied or very satisfied with the comfort they or their children receive from the VIP dogs.





After nearly 8 years of exemplary service, **Fletcher**, the accredited facility dog, retired in June 2023 after supporting **1,614 children** and youth who experienced abuse.
